WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that every local government unit (LGU) shall exercise powers which are essential for the promotion of the general welfare within their respective territorial jurisdiction, every LGU shall ensure support and promote the health and safety of its inhabitants;

WHEREAS, Proclamation No. 929 s. 2020, was issued declaring a State of Public Health Emergency throughout the Philippines due to Corona Virus Disease 91 (CoVid-19), enjoining all government agencies and local government units (LGUs) to render full assistance and cooperation and mobilize the necessary resources to undertake critical, urgent and appropriate response and measures in a timely manner to curtail and eliminate the threat of CoVid-19;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 11469, or the "Bayanihan to Heal as One", has placed the country in a State of National Emergency, and has declared the urgent need to: (a) mitigate if not contain the transmission of CoVid-19; (b) undertake measures that will prevent in the overburdening of the healthcare system; (c) immediate and amply provide healthcare, including medical tests and treatments, to CoVid-19 patients, persons under investigation (PUPs), or persons under monitoring (PUMs); (d) ensure that there is sufficient, adequate and readily available funding to undertake the foregoing; (e) partner with the private sector and other stakeholders to deliver these measures and programs quickly and efficiently; (h) promote and protect the collective interests of all Filipinos in these challenging times;

WHEREAS, Department of the Interior and Local Government Memorandum Circular No. 2020-077 dated April 24, 2020 was issued directing all local government units to fully establish and activate their respective Local Task Force against CoVid-19 and align all their actions with the national strategy framework;

WHEREAS, following the above-stated constitutional mandates and memorandum circulars, the Local Government Unit of Marcos with its desire for effective and efficient governance there is a need to reconstitute the local task force against CoVid-19 and reorganize teams to address problems brought by CoVid-19;

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of health, safety and welfare of the people of the Municipality of Marcos, with the aim to directly respond to the needs for mitigation and reduction of CoVid-19 to the whole municipality.

WHEREFORE, premises considered and by virtue of the powers vested in me under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines, I, ANTONIO V.
